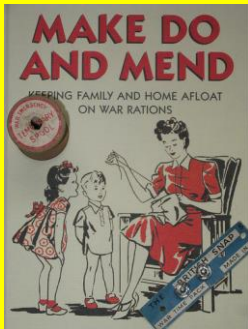


WW2 - Year 3 and 4 Homework

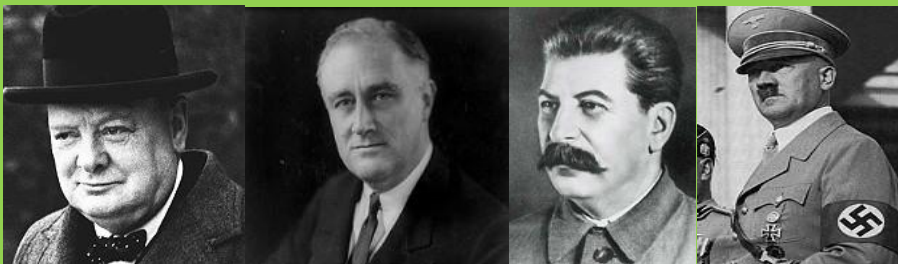
Scrap heap challenge

Make a suitcase out of a cereal box and then place the items in it that you would take with you if you had to be evacuated!



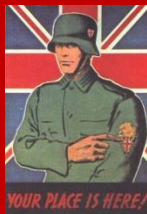
War time food!

Make a war time thrifty dish! Take photos and write up the instructions. Enjoy!



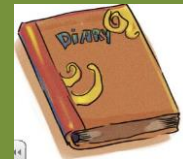
Propoganda
